It became the task of Vice President for University Advancement Kevin Haslam to fund the initiative that would bring Harrison Fountain and Plaza back to its former glory, and thus, The Legacy Initiative was born. Haslam spoke about how vital this process has been as well as how clearly UNA's alumni and friends have responded to the call to help.

Q: Harrison Fountain was built on a foundation of giving. How does that foundation continue with this initiative?
