Dear Friends,

Like all institutions of higher education, the pandemic of 2020 has challenged us at the University of North Alabama in ways small and large. We've been forced to adapt in all facets of university life. From course delivery to athletics and from our beloved Una passed away.

Despite these challenges, our University – your University – is thriving and showing the spirit and grit that has become our hallmark throughout the last 190 years. Consider some of our recent accomplishments. Enrollment for Fall 2020 set a new record with a total of almost 8400 students, up 4 percent over Fall 2019. Also up this fall are our retention and graduation rates – and that speaks volumes about student satisfaction with the UNA experience.

Integral to that experience is our beautiful campus and state-of-the-art

Dear UNA Family and Friends:

A lot has happened in the 12 months since our last Annual Report. In December, a portion of the Harrison Fountain collapsed. In March, COVID-19 was declared a pandemic. May brought civil unrest over racial injustice issues. And in June, our beloved Una passed away.

James Lane Allen once said, "Adversity does not build character, it reveals it." In the exemplary Spring 2020 edition of UNA Magazine referring only to the pandemic, I wrote, "We will overcome this for the same reason that this great University has overcome adversities for 190 years...because of the quality and character of the people!" Not surprisingly, through personal, national, and global struggles, the collective UNA Family has shown ourselves to be giants of character. I would like to note just a few of your many, many accomplishments during this past year:

- 414 donors giving 600 gifts totaling \$256,033.

it has changed life on the University of North Alabama campus, the collapse of Harrison Fountain at the end of 2019 perhaps set the tone for the change and disruption that lay ahead. UNA's iconic center of campus, however, was swift and decisive. It was clear that the landmark, often considered the heart of UNA, would be rebuilt, and along with the reconstructed fountain, the surrounding plaza would get a facelift as well.

It became the task of Vice President for University Advancement Kevin Haslam to fund the initiative that would bring Harrison Fountain and Plaza back to its former glory, and thus, The Legacy Initiative was born. Haslam spoke about how vital this process has been as well as how clearly UNA's alumni and friends have responded to the call to help.



**Q:** Harrison Fountain was built on a foundation of giving. How does that foundation continue with this initiative?

These are traits that the Harrison family continues to exemplify to this day. It is this spirit that has inspired many of us to participate in the restoration. The Legacy Initiative was developed by the Advancement team with the intent of giving everyone who wants to participate the opportunity to do so. Dr. and Mrs. Harrison initially made the fountain and plaza possible, and we want everyone who shares their spirit to have the opportunity to do the same.

**Q:** We've experienced so much success related to the larger items as part of the initiative. To what do you attribute that success?

**A:** I think a couple of things. First, this is a unique opportunity. All of the naming opportunities are unique to this need at this time, and they will be in the Plaza permanently. 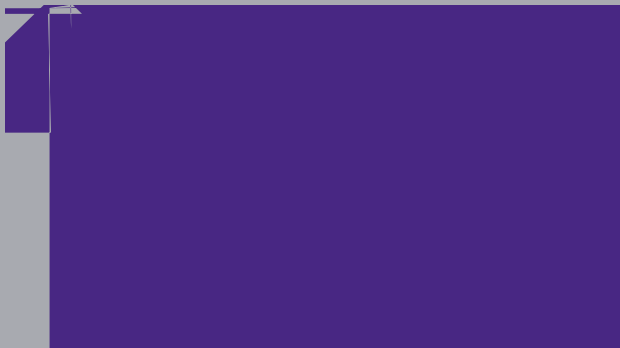
